### **Every Child Matters and Every Day Counts!**

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Children learn new things when they are in school every day – missing school puts them behind.


### Why it's important

We all want our children to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with children coming to school each and every day.

If children miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a child misses school this puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.





Attendance that falls below 90% is called Persistent Absence (PA)

At Buckland Primary School we achieved 95.3% attendance for the academic year 2017-18 and are now aiming for 95.5% or above.

### **Absence through Illness**

We understand that there are times when children are unwell. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, as parents, setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference. We have devised a useful reference guide to help you decide when you should keep your child at home.



#### Attendance matters!

Don't underestimate the importance of 100 percent attendance. Even <u>ONE</u> day missed can have an effect on learning:

- 98 percent attendance means four school days missed
- 95 percent attendance means 10 school days missed
- 90 percent attendance means 19 school days missed
- 80 percent attendance means 38 school days missed
- Five minutes late each day means three school days missed

Please help us promote good attendance throughout our school – you really do play an important role.

## Absence during term time & Fixed Penalty Notices

Absence will not be authorised during term time except in rare and exceptional circumstances. It is very important that all parents and carers understand that children with unauthorised absences, including holidays, unexplained absences and unauthorised illness, are at risk of receiving a Fixed Penalty Notice from Surrey County Council.

If you need to request absence from learning, please complete the Leave Request Form which can be collected from the school office or downloaded from the website, and return to the school office. Once the form has been submitted we will write to parents advising the outcome of the request.
